

Defining and using Secondary IDs


All Folders created using **Second Opinion**TM **Professional** contain two key fields, the **Visible ID** and the **Description** of the Folder. In most cases, these are the **ID** and **Name** of a Patient.




Other information related to the Patient's folder, like demographic information, is stored in a separated form/databases.


Currently, the Folder database does not have a field defined for a **Secondary ID**. To overcome this limitation, we have created a workaround to allow the user to type in a **Secondary ID**, and this **ID** is recognized in other programs such as our **Image Export Manager**.

If **Secondary ID**s are required for your use case, the default **Med01** demographics form needs to be replaced with a different one that contains the Secondary ID field. Below is an example form.






To add a **Secondary ID** to an existing Folder, a special **Edit Folder** form needs to be installed. Contact Technical Support and they will help you get it installed.





Export Manager

The **Image Export Manager** is one of the programs that recognizes the **Secondary ID** field. During the exporting of Images, the **Image Stamp** of an Image can be changed to include the **Secondary ID**. This is helpful when de-identifying an Image when being used in a Clinical Trial.
